ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This vernacular one and a half story residence with pitched roof is typical of the vernacular dwellings built in the North End during the second half of the nineteenth century. The architectural detail is kept to a minimum. The Victorian influence is seen in the elaborate brackets that cornice.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

This house was probably built by W. Merritt noted as the owner in the 1884 Atlas of Essex County. This was possibly William H. Merritt, a ship carpenter who lived in the North End.

Prior to 1913 this property was acquired by Robert C. Bridge who sold it to George B. Greaton in that year.
