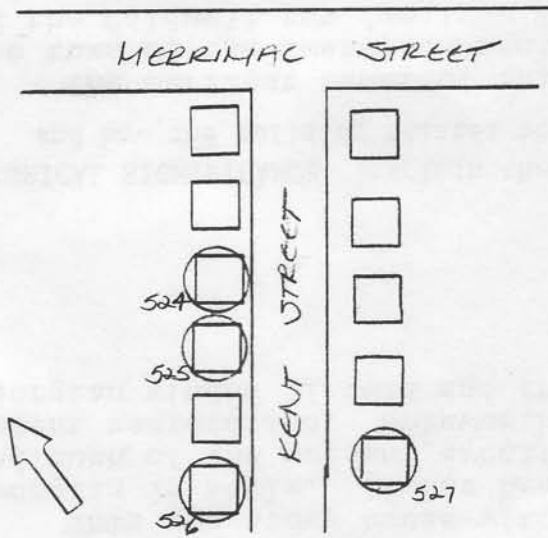

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This two story house with pitched roof and three bay facade is Georgian in style. It has been extensively renovated in recent years and much of the present architectural finish appears to date from this recent restoration. Noteworthy features of the building include the Georgian window lintels and the fieldstone foundation.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

The earliest owner of this house has yet to be documented. At the turn of the twentieth century the property was owned by John Caldwell of the Caldwell rum family. In 1918 the property passed to Caldwell's heirs who sold it to Vincenzo Tirone.

This house was totally renovated in 1972.
