ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

Although this two story house with pitched roof is vernacular in style it has several interesting features that were popular during the Victorian period. These include the projecting gable bays, the vertical board and batten timber in the gable of the roof and the turned posts supporting the porch. The small window panes around a larger pane and the sunburst motif in the gables over the bays are features that commonly occurred in the Queen Anne style popular in the late nineteenth century.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

Charles W. Blake owned this property and may have been the original owner of the house. Before 1948, Hattie Blake left the house to Allan and Marion Shepard who sold it in that year.
