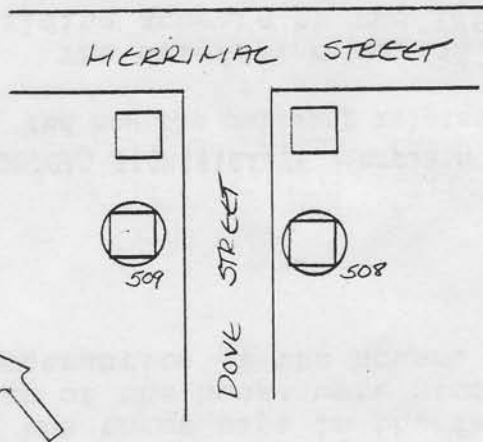

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This two story house with pitched roof and three bay facade is vernacular in style. It has several Georgian features. The spacing of the three bays in the facade is Georgian. The lean-tos at the rear of the house were probably added shortly after the original construction of the house.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

The original owner of this house has yet to be documented. The building appears on the 1851 and 1872 maps of Newburyport. The owners of the property are not noted.

In 1909 Daniel Creeden sold this house to Michael Creeden. The house remained in the Creeden family until 1926 when it was sold to William E. Bergeron.
