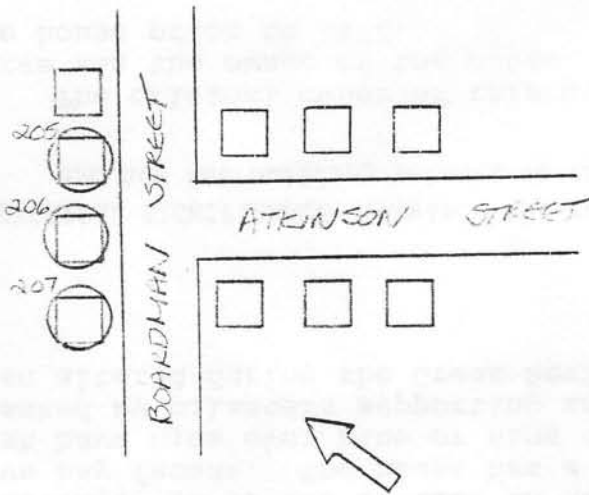

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This house is an excellent example of a modest eighteenth century dwelling. It is two stories in height with pitched roof and symmetrical, five bay facade. The house has a central chimney. The double hung window sash have nine over nine or nine over six lights. The front doorway is flanked by pilasters supporting an entablature above. The doorway may have been altered during the Greek Revival period.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

The original owner of this property is not known. In 1851, Michael Morse was the owner of the house. Morse was a ship carpenter. He sold the house prior to 1872.

In 1884, Joseph B. Little was the owner of the property. He sold it to Daniel Casey in 1908.
