ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This house is vernacular in style and is typical of the worker's cottages built in Newburyport between 1850 and 1880. The house has features reminiscent of the earlier Greek Revival style. These include the gable roof facing the street, the cornerboards, and the bold doorway. The brackets under the eaves and in the doorway entablature are a later Victorian feature.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

In 1872 this house was owned by Aaron E. Bowen. Bowen was a carpenter and could very well have been responsible for the original design and construction of the building. Bowen lived in the North End so this was probably an investment property.

By 1884, the house had been sold to Emma M. Wheelwright, widow. In 1924, the house was owned by Marietta R. Little. Her husband John M. Little was in the furniture moving business.
