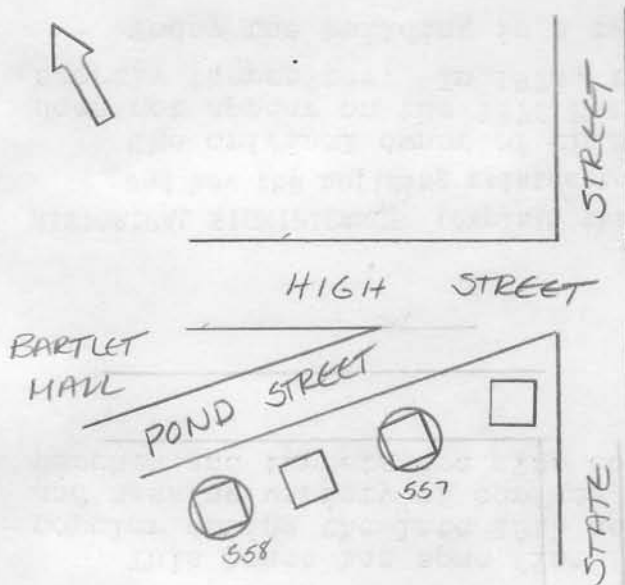

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This house has some fine features of the Queen Anne style that was popular during the late 19th century. These include irregularity of plan and massing variety of surface textures and round-arched windows. Gables, porches and turrets are also common features of this style.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

The original owner of this house has yet to be documented. The house does not appear on the 1872 Map of Newburyport. It was probably built shortly thereafter. In 1924, the owner of the house was George W. Marquand.

Today the building is a two-family house.
